U.S. National Training Center Selects Advanced Interactive Systems, Inc.

New Project Provides Virtual Reality Training to Civilian Responder Community

SEATTLE – March 24, 2004 – The National Corrections and Law Enforcement Training Technology Center at Moundsville, West Virginia has awarded the Reality Response division of Advanced Interactive Systems, Inc. (www.ais-sim.com) a contract to develop and deliver an SVS™ training system for first responders.

The Moundsville Mock Disaster 2004 Planning Committee will use the SVS™ virtual reality training system as a pre-exercise training tool for participants in the upcoming Mock Disaster in September. SVS™ provides 3D virtual reality training in highly realistic urban environments for emergency response personnel.

“Virtual training with SVS and the Moundsville city model with this pre-exercise will significantly enhance the experience of the participants during the live Mock Disaster exercise,” said Steve Morrison, Executive Director of the National Corrections & Law Enforcement Training & Technology Center. “The capabilities of this system are something we have never had before. It allows incident commanders to exercise their skills and give us the ability to fine-tune the proficiency of a unified command post.”

The virtual reality simulation software from Advanced Interactive Systems, allows cross-disciplinary response personnel to participate in coordinated, interactive training and exercises for terrorist attacks or other highly dangerous events in extremely realistic simulated environments. This is accomplished by creating synthetic environments replicating the location, overlaying scenarios, and enabling participation in the virtual training or exercises by dozens of participants through broadband Internet connections. Multi-disciplinary responders can participate simply by logging on to the LAN/WAN through their PCs.

In advance of the Mock Disaster, Reality Response will create a virtual model of Moundsville and insert training scenarios into it. Prior to the September exercise, participants will be able to train together in the virtual Moundsville without actually traveling there.

“It is extremely important to make sure this state-of-the-art virtual reality training from the military world is made available to the civilian responder community,” says Tim May, President and CEO of Advanced Interactive Systems.
